Publication Guidelines

Category I - Researched Writings. This category includes original writings about the history or pre-history of the county that have been extensively researched and documented by accompanying reference citations to the original information sources. Typically these submissions can be several pages, with endnotes.

Category II - Descriptions/Stories, Etc. This category includes submissions of a historical nature that include first-hand descriptions of places, people, or events; writings from general knowledge; oral and/or written histories of people or families; or any other pieces that seem to fit within the theme of the journal.

Examples include:

A description of a place, person, or event.

(This could be an event that took place recently or in the more distant past - this would be written from general knowledge or research, as opposed to a researched and documented writing (see below))

A history of a person or family.

(How a person or family came to the Riverside County area; genealogical research on families in the area; or an oral history of yourself or a friend/acquaintance)

Please note: All submissions will remain the property of the author. The author gives the Riverside County Chronicles the right to publish it once in the journal.

Additional Items:

Correspondence - Readers are encouraged to send in ideas or to offer additional information about an article or tidbit.

Book Reviews - Submissions of book reviews are always welcome. Whether the book is new or old, a good review always helps to give a perspective as to how the book can help one learn. Any book can be reviewed, so long as it pertains to the area.
