Directions to the Historic Hemet Theater - 216 East Florida Avenue, Hemet

(See maps on other side)

From the I-215 freeway in Romoland, take the exit for SR 74 (if coming from the north) or Ethanac Road (if coming from the south). Head east along SR 74 into Hemet (SR 74 is Florida Avenue in Hemet). The Historic Hemet Theater will be two blocks east of State Street on the left.

From the I-10 in Banning/Beaumont - Take Beaumont Avenue/SR 79 exit from the I-10 and proceed south through Lamb's Canyon. At the intersection of the Ramona Expressway, turn left and continue to State Street. Turn right and continue to Florida Avenue. Turn left on Florida Avenue - the Historic Hemet Theater will be two blocks east of State Street on the left.



From the Coachella Valley - Take SR 74 from Palm Desert over the San Jacinto Mountains and continue into Hemet where SR 74 becomes Florida Avenue. The Historic Hemet Theater will be on the right just beyond the corner of Florida Avenue and Carmenita Street.

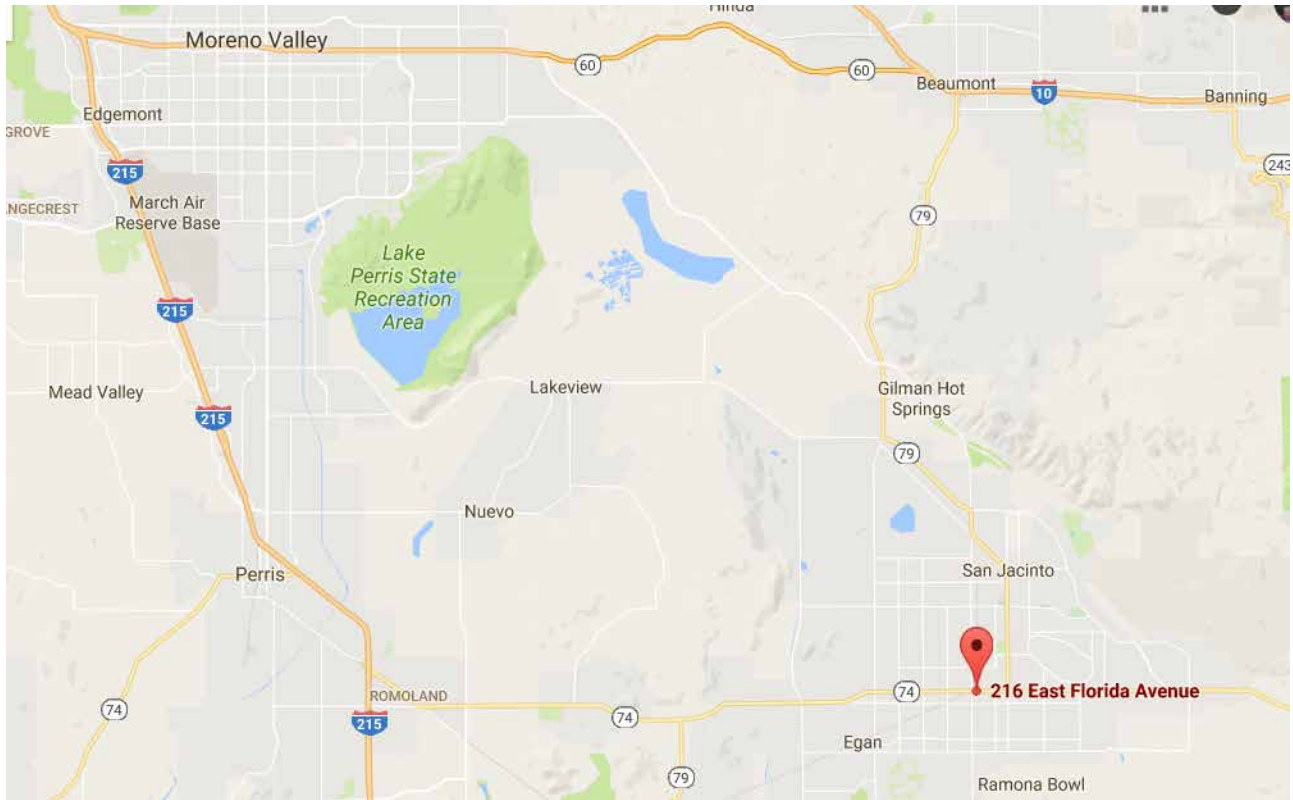
Parking - Parking is on the streets surrounding the theater and in two small lots north and northeast of the theater. Come early for a better parking space and allow extra time for parking/walking.

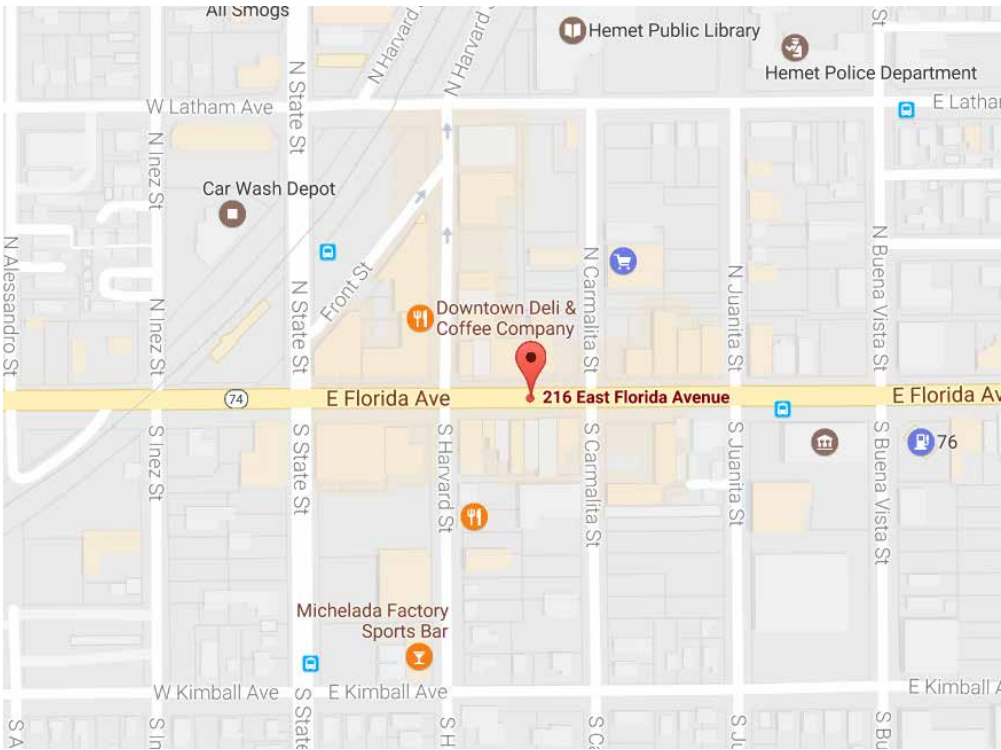
